## A BIT OF CHAPEL HISTORY *by Mary Beth Chandler*

As some of us will recall the chapel at the "Old Monastery" was built in 1954. At the time the nuns had not yet returned to Mt. Carmel. When in 1974 they did arrive, a choir extension was haphazardly added to the side of the Chapel for the nuns to attend Mass separately from the main publica.

In 1950 Father Lawrence Kelly wrote in his book, *A Carmelite Shrine in Maryland*, "a chapel would be built on the Monastery grounds. The estimated cost would be \$25,000. The resources to meet this cost will be the annual fees of active and honorary members, memorials and perpetual memberships, appeals to the devotees of Our Lady and the friends of the Carmelites in this country.

To repeat a wish already expressed or intimated, who knows but that, in God's providence and with the gracious favor of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, after the chapel has been built the nuns will return again to Port Tobacco some day in the not too distance future and another Carmel will rise to grace that sacred spot."

It took another twenty-four years before the nuns did return to this sacred ground. The seventy-year-old chapel is now being renovated to include a proper choir enclosure for the nuns.

## HISTORICAL RESTORATION OF OLD MONASTERY *by Angela McConkey*

During the fall of 2022, restorative work was undertaken to beautify and preserve the original, historic monastery. Under the strict tutelage and supervision of Bill Hoxie, Carmel of Port Tobacco's dedicated master carpenter and groundskeeper, volunteers were set to work. Cobwebs were cleared from every crack and crevice; soot and dirt from the old fireplace vacuumed out; the windows wiped clean; and the wood walls and furniture were given a good polish. Damaged floorboards were replaced and stained. The old floors, original to the renovated monastery, were first scrubbed clean by hand, then mopped, before a mixture of linseed oil and wax was applied to freshen and preserve. After a couple of days of letting the polish application dry, the floors were buffed to a renewed and healthy shine. New signage was added to the Blessed Saints' pictures to identify and memorialize their importance to Mount Carmel for visiting pilgrims.

The Winter 2022 Port Tobacco Tidings Newsletter described the work that was completed: *"Eighty-seven years has taken its toll. This enforced lull in our plans seemed like a good opportunity to give it some tender, loving care. With the help of some friends, the floor has been repaired where needed and brought to a beautiful shine. Signage has been improved, with more work to follow."*
